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The beginning

The idea of a European Magazine (*Children in Europe*) arose from some members of the European Network supported from the European Commission from 1986 to 1996 and coordinated by Peter Moss. The project took shape in the course of two meetings in Catalonia on 2000 (Saifores and Barcelona) by a small network of magazines from Belgium, Denmark, France, Italy, Spain and the United Kingdom.

Children in Europe was launched as a magazine in Glasgow (Scotland) in September 2001. At a time when little was happening at an EU level, its intention was to provide a forum or meeting place for the exchange of ideas, practice and information, with each issue examining a major issue affecting services for young children and their families. Over the past decade the network has grown bringing in other partners across Europe, including Eastern Europe.

The magazine now appears in fourteen languages across Europe.

Initiated by the partner magazines and still largely funded through self generated income, since September 2002, *Children in Europe* has been supported through funding from the Bernard Van Leer Foundation.

The aim

"Welcome to the first issue of a new publication - *Children in Europe* - a collaboration between a network of national magazines from seven European countries. Our main aim is to provide a forum or meeting place for the exchange of ideas, practice and information. Each edition - two a year to begin with, more frequently we hope later - will take a major issue affecting services for young children and their families, and examine it from various perspectives. Our first issue is on listening to young children. This edition shows how this issue is becoming an important subject in many European countries, across Children in Europe's whole age range of children from 0 to 10 years. We bring together articles on practice and research, drawing on different theories and disciplines, raising many questions not only about how to listen, but also about what listening means and why listening matters."
